The DeGol Legacy

Remembering Bruno DeGol and His Legacy

The University lost a great friend with the passing of Bruno DeGol, Sr. on May 14, 2009. Though DeGol was not himself a graduate of Saint Francis, several of his children and grandchildren are alumni, and his grandson Bruno DeGol III is currently a sophomore majoring in business administration at Saint Francis and playing football on the field that bears the family name.



directors for the Laurel Bank; Gallitzin Savings and Loan; C&G Savings Bank; and the B.T. Financial Corp. He also served on the Gallitzin Borough Council and the board of trustees and the president's cabinet at Saint Francis.

A native of western Pennsylvania, he grew up in a large Italian family, one of 11 children. As a young man, he served in the Army 102nd Infantry Division in World War II, participated in the D-Day Invasion, and was awarded the Bronze Star and numerous campaign medals.

Always civic-minded, DeGol was involved in many community and charitable organizations including the Gallitzin VFW, American Legion, Knights of Columbus Council, and Gallitzin Lions Club, for which he served as president. In later years, his philanthropic interests lead to the establishment of the Bruno & Lena DeGol Family Foundation, focusing on local charitable organizations in Cambria and Blair counties.



After the war, in 1950, he embarked on his first business venture, founding DeGol Brothers, a concrete manufacturing company with his brother Victor; this business was the first piece of what later became The DeGol organization, a diversified and widespread family business. In 1958, he expanded the company into the building materials business and renamed it DeGol Brothers Lumber. Over the years, there was continued expansion as four additional locations were added in Blair and Cambria counties. In 1972, he founded Seven D Wholesale with sons Donald and Dennis and has since added four other locations to that venture: Scranton, PA; Newmanstown, PA; Hartford, CT; and Deerfield Beach, FL.

Believing in the benefits of a Catholic, Franciscan education and seeing his children thrive at Saint Francis led DeGol to become one of the University's most generous donors. He was the primary donor on several significant building projects, including DeGol Arena, DeGol Field, and DeGol Fieldhouse.

In 1975, he and his son David established DeGol Carpet with locations in Duncansville and Tyrone. In 1982, the company acquired Scotch Valley Country Club in Hollidaysburg, PA. Always good at reading market needs, DeGol continued diversifying the business further with son Bruno Jr. by forming Seven D Industries in 1990, a truss and window manufacturer.

On his passing, Fr. Gabriel Zeis, T.O.R., University president, said, "Bruno DeGol Sr.'s legacy will be his tremendous desire to help the young people of our area grow, not only academically and physically, but also spiritually. Bruno had a tremendous vision for what Saint Francis University could offer, and through his generosity and commitment to vision, he succeeded in accomplishing his dreams and goals."

His business acumen was widely recognized, and his expertise was highly sought. He served on the board of

He received many awards, including an honorary doctorate and the Bel Cuore award from Saint Francis, as well as the Ernst & Young Western Pennsylvania Master Entrepreneur Award and the American Rescue Workers Distinguished National Humanitarian Award. The DeGol Organization was inducted into the Blair County Business Hall of Fame, and he was inducted into the Greater Johnstown/Cambria County Hall of Fame.
